Firstly is the ongoing engagement we are having with readers about the closure of Duddingston Low Road. Unsurprisingly there are differing views and, having published a letter last month, we received further in response and they are anonymised and published on Page 11. We remain happy to continue publishing letters on this or any other issues readers feel inclined to write in about.

The second part of the theme is about the Scottish Elections due in May next year. It might seem a long way away but time flies and our journalism student (Shaun McGeachan) is keen to hone his skills so we have started what I hope will be a series of interviews with each candidate. The first (Page 18) is local Councillor Tim Jones who has been selected as the Scottish Conservative candidate for the new Edinburgh Eastern,

Musselburgh & Tranent Constituency.

Finally, an issue not otherwise mentioned as it doesn't have particular local relevance but nevertheless important to mention, is a Consultation by the City Council on a proposed Tram extension between Granton and Little France. All views are sought by the deadline 17th November and I encourage you to take part. Best way is to search online "Edinburgh Tram Extension" then click on the "Council seeks views on tram expansion plans". The £3Bil project would need an initial £44Mil to produce a business case report before anything can be done and at such huge expense it is important to get as many views as possible before a decision is made.

Here is a summary of some of the main articles reported by a range of media outlets and posted on our Facebook Page that relate to our local area including Duddingston, Brunstane, Portobello & Willowbrae.



A new community garden, Jock Tamson's Gairden, has opened in Duddingston, turning unused land into a shared space for growing food and supporting wellbeing, especially for people with cancer. Named after the local figure behind the phrase "we're a' Jock Tamson's bairns," it was created by local volunteers with support from the council and Macmillan. The garden includes a café, report Deadline News.

A new red-light camera went live on 22 September 2025 at the A6106 **Duddingston Park South junction** to improve road safety. The site was chosen after 11 collisions in four years and a survey showing 190 red-light offences in 12 hours, over half



on Duddingston Park South. The move is part of Police Scotland Safety Cameras' efforts to reduce serious road injuries and fatalities, say The *Edinburgh Reporter*.

Edinburgh News report that **Duddingston Golf Club** have won the Edinburgh Summer League title for a record 11th



time, defeating Craigielaw 5–4 in a close final at Bruntsfield Links. The victory capped an unbeaten season, with standout performances from players like Shaun Gordon and Jamie Duguid. Team manager praised the squad's commitment, and Duddingston will now face Glasgow in the Inter-Cities Cup.

Edinburgh MP Chris Murray temporarily closed his Portobello High Street office after a security incident on October 3, 2025. Police attended following reports of a disturbance, though no link was found to recent national events. Police Scotland said officers gave advice at the scene, and the MP assured constituents appointments

Following an August wildfire on Arthur's Seat, rockfalls have increased, forcing the continued closure of the High Road for safety reasons. Historic Environment Scotland says geologists are assessing the area, but no reopening date has been set.

Earlier, **Duddingston Low was Road also closed** due to similar risks and remains shut to traffic, with full repairs expected to take 12–18 months. HES has yet to decide what level of access will be allowed once the works are complete, say **Edinburgh News**.

Dear Ben,

I always enjoy reading Duddingston magazine, and the latest edition was no exception—thank you for your continued efforts in bringing local stories to life. One article in the news section particularly caught my eye: the call to reopen Duddingston Low Road. I felt it was important to highlight that there are also strong calls for the road to remain closed.

Holyrood Park is a designated Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), and Duddingston Loch is both an SSSI and a Scottish Wildlife Trust reserve. The park is incredibly biodiverse, home to hundreds of species of birds, toads, butterflies, mammals, plants, trees, ferns, lichens, fungi, and mosses. This delicate environment is adversely affected by vehicle traffic through the park—especially through increased noise, light, and air pollution.

Many existing user groups, including pedestrians and cyclists, support keeping the road closed to motor traffic. There are numerous alternative routes into the city, and maintaining the current closure helps protect the park's unique natural character and tranquillity.

I would also encourage a closer look at the claim that the closure has caused significant traffic delays. As a local resident, this has not been my experience, and it may be worth factchecking for balance.

It would be wonderful if the magazine could explore the other side of this discussion, including the many environmental and community benefits of keeping the road closed.

Hi there,

I'd like to respond to a couple of recent letters on the Low Road closure. I'm frankly flabbergasted by the entitled attitudes of some drivers — and I say this as a driver myself. Convenience should never come before community safety and environmental impact.

The Low Road is closed due to an extreme risk to life from rockfall, as confirmed in a Historic Environment

Scotland report. As a resident of Duddingston Road West, I welcome the peace it has brought, especially in Duddingston Village which I now use more often. Access to the Low Road through the village was always horrendous, with cars beeping, weaving, and queuing - both in the village and past my house. If the Low Road were ever to be reopened, the council must address the access issues through Duddingston Village as currently, it's not fit for purpose.

The Low Road closure is not to blame for perceived and over exaggerated congestion at Peffermill. This has always been a congested crossing. I drive through daily and have seen no increase. Drivers must consider closures at Niddrie Road, the Fort, the Commonwealth Pool, and Cameron Toll — plus terrible light sequencing. As for idling, vehicles do this whether stuck in the village, on the Low Road, or on Duddingston Road West.

For the first time, I feel safe walking and cycling on the Low Road and now cycle to work most days, it's also great to now see so many other people walk and cycle along a road that was previously a risk due to the volume of cars and vans. Not to mention the potential rock fall. The village is calmer and safer as a result also — something worth preserving.



Tim Jones has been serving as Councillor for Portobello and Craigmillar since

2022. However, next year he will be running for election as an MSP to represent Edinburgh Eastern, Musselburgh and Tranent at Holyrood.

Cllr Jones believes that, with his experience and knowledge of the area, he would be an effective representative in Parliament and focus on issues that matter to locals. Whilst representing the ward during his council term, he has been a lead campaigner for the reopening of Brunstane Road, which affects travel and everyday life for locals. He also disputed the proposal of controlled parking measures along King's Road to Joppa, which many residents appeared to be severely unhappy with, showing he is not afraid to stand up for those he represents and aims to avoid neglecting their

opinion. This is something he hopes to continue on a national level, should he be elected as an MSP, as he believes it is vital to gain trust of the public.

One of the Committees Tim has been a part of during his Council term is the Culture and Communities Committee and believes Portobello Community Council needs to be reinstated in order to connect people and enhance the representation of the public when decisions that affect them are being made.

Another Committee Tim is currently a part of is Policy and Sustainability. During this stint he has worked to prevent vulnerable structures on the coast, such as buildings near Portobello Beach, facing major damage from storms, which had a large impact on many people at the start of this year. However, this is something he believes needs

more work, time and money in order to assist as many affected households and business as possible.

As an ex-teacher, Tim is very passionate about education, something he believes needs immediate change and improvement. He thinks the education system needs restoration after a dramatic decline, partly connected to the COVID-19 Pandemic, and feels a need for more alignment between the curriculum and assessments, that should feature outcomes for children to achieve through stages.

Cllr Jones is a real admirer of one of the biggest landmarks in the constituency,
Portobello Beach, and particularly enjoys visits on busy, hot days, when a walk along the promenade, enjoying the grand beach and its glistening sand, can be a real help.


